Similarly, over **70% of parents** sending their children to faith-based schools support the right of a religious school to be able to **teach students their values and beliefs about gender, sexuality and marriage,** with this supported by a majority of all voters

Not only do over 80% of those actively practicing a religious faith support these protections, but they were also **supported by a** majority of voters not actively practicing any religious faith

84% of all voters

support the right of all students to receive some level of **taxpayer funding**, which is consistent with previous results.
