This independent national research was completed by Compass Polling on behalf of an alliance of Australian Christian Schools using a state-weighted sample of 505 via online panels. The sample is representative of the Australian population on key demographics reflected in the 2021 Census. The polling was conducted from 1-16 March 2024.
